About Devon Air Ambulance

Our first mission flew on 27 August 1992, thanks to the tireless efforts of Ann Ralli, who launched the 'Ceri Thomas Appeal' after the tragic loss of her son in 1986. Her determination helped fund Devon's first Air Ambulance.

From flying just five days a week, we've grown into a clinically independent service operating two aircraft and four rapid response Critical Care Cars (CCCs). In 2020, we introduced our Airbus H145 with a bespoke interior and advanced medical tech, extended our hours to 2am, and launched our Patient and Family Support Team.

Devon's geography can make getting the right emergency treatment to patients challenging and when every second counts, getting the specialist skills of our Critical Care Doctors and Paramedics to scene is paramount. Our aircraft and CCCs bring our Critical Care Doctors and Paramedics directly to patients, wherever they are. The CCCs are especially effective in urban areas and during poor weather or aircraft maintenance, carrying the same life-saving equipment as our helicopters.

Our crew undergoes specialist training, enabling them to deliver advanced interventions and prescribe treatments at the scene. Their specialist life-saving treatments and interventions to slow, halt or even reverse the effects of a life-threatening condition, is crucial in helping to achieve a successful outcome.

Patient story: **Martin Parkhouse**

Local farmer almost loses leg in remote farming incident

On a sunny Sunday in October 2023, what began as a routine day on the farm for vegetable grower Martin turned into a life-altering emergency—one that highlighted the importance of rapid response, teamwork, and the critical care provided by Devon Air Ambulance (DAA).

Martin was working with his colleague and close friend Rupert, operating a forage harvester. When the machine became blocked, Rupert followed safety protocol and shut it down so Martin could clear the obstruction. Despite taking all precautions, a hidden piece of debris had wrapped around Martin's ankle. When the engine restarted, he was pulled into the machine.

Rupert's quick thinking saved Martin's life. He immediately shut off the engine, used his belt as a tourniquet, and held Martin upright.

"Rupert saved my life and potentially my leg," Martin said. "He doesn't realise how amazing he is."

As the situation unfolded, fellow farmer Josh arrived and instinctively called 999. Within minutes, four more colleagues were at Martin's side—applying pressure, keeping him conscious, and preparing for the arrival of emergency services.

Emergency Services Mobilised

Thanks to our supporters, including our corporate partners, DAA was able to respond rapidly. Alongside Devon & Somerset Fire and Rescue, HART, and a BASICS doctor, DAA's Dr. Lauren Weekes and Advanced Prehospital Practitioner Alex Sanders-Page worked to stabilise Martin. They applied a medical-grade tourniquet and carefully extricated him from the machinery, relieving his colleagues one by one.

Due to the need to keep Martin upright, sedation wasn't possible until he was safely laid down. Once stable, he was airlifted to Derriford Hospital. His wife Jenna was notified and arrived just in time to see him before his first surgery.

A Long Road to Recovery

Martin underwent over 30 hours of surgery to save and rebuild his leg. With the unwavering support of his family, friends, and medical teams, he was discharged in time for Christmas. Though he faced a setback due to a severe infection, Martin is now walking his dog and driving again.

He continues to recover and is passionate about giving back. Most recently, he shared his story at DAA's Medi-Connect Conference to raise awareness within the agricultural community.

"I want to say a massive thank you to everyone at Devon Air Ambulance and Derriford Hospital," Martin said. "My brothers Andrew and Richard were constantly by my side. I've also had incredible support from DAA's Adrian, Masons Kings, my colleagues, and my family."

Corporate partnership spotlight: **Perrigo UK**

Perrigo UK, one of the world's largest and the UK's fastest-growing major OTC manufacturers, has been a proud supporter of Devon Air Ambulance for many years. Since acquiring Wrafton Laboratories Ltd in Braunton in 2001—now its main manufacturing site—Perrigo has embedded community support into its culture.

Through their ongoing partnership, Perrigo has raised over **£34,000** to date, with **£8,000 raised in the last year alone**. These vital funds enabled the purchase of a replacement **LUCAS machine**—a life-saving device that delivers mechanical chest compressions to patients in cardiac arrest, ensuring consistent and effective CPR during critical moments.

Perrigo's team leads with creativity and enthusiasm in their fundraising efforts. Most recently, staff took part in our **Bake Off for Take Off** campaign, donning aprons and baking incredible cakes to sell to colleagues—raising nearly **£200** through this fun and engaging initiative.

Their commitment goes beyond fundraising. Staff members have visited one of our airbases to see the LUCAS machine in action, learn more about our operations, and understand how their contributions directly support life-saving missions. They also participated in **CPR and defibrillator training**, reinforcing the importance of these essential skills and the real impact their support has on local lives.
